LIFE AFTER STEVE

So we face another vacancy for a new Rector. Before we all jump to conclusions about the sort of person we need, it might be instructive to consider Steve's achievements amongst us, then how we can move forward from where he has left off.

I have had the great privilege of working with 4 Rectors over my 20+ years in the Exe Valley. I have seen their joys in ministry but I have also seen their frustrations and difficult times and it is probably true to say that the latter outnumber the former. We must all ask "Why is this?" Why have all these Rectors, and indeed many of the Team Vicars working with them, found some of their time in the Exe Valley so difficult to cope with?

Of course we are not alone in this many rural clergy find ministry quite a strain and it is a sad fact that the number of stipendiary clergy taking time off with stress related problems is far too high. Neither is this a modern experience. In our current studies, in Paul's second letter to Timothy, we find the Apostle in some sadness, even despair, over such things as dislovalty amongst church members, false teaching infecting the faithful and church officers leaving the faith. Indeed, the Apostle warns his young disciple Timothy that suffering is going to be part of his experience if he remains faithful to the Gospel.

As we prepare for a time of vacancy and then, hopefully, for another Rector to be willing to take up the reigns, it is incumbent upon us all to seek to make Parish life here in the Exe Valley workable. We are 9 parishes and we each have our own PCC, so that results in something like 36 PCC meetings a year. demonstrating the impossibility of attending more than a selection. Also we will have to look at the number of services that each parish holds, currently totalling up to 28 a month - the Rector is responsible for the content and preaching in each service, how can we make that task possible?

RURAL MINISTRY

Steve has taken some brave steps towards making the Rector's job more manageable. He has asked us to limit the number of services each parish church holds. Steve has also set up for us the situation in which we may invite children and adults who are not used to church, to come and worship and hear the Gospel & the Bible explained week by week, in a non "churchy" atmosphere, remembering that "the Church is the only organisation that exists for the benefit of its nonmembers". It is great to see that some are taking advantage of this opportunity at EVC.

I am sure that Steve would be the first to admit that he has not always got things right - which of us has never made a mistake? For some of us, his changes have been too rapid and too extreme. For others his attempts to point out the difference between a "Status Quo" Christianity and the transforming Gospel of the Bible, have been a little abrupt but nevertheless he has succeeded in making this contrast. It is now up to us to move forward from this point. Maybe there has been too little emphasis upon village and parish life, which is important to all of us, but again how can we achieve this whilst making the Rector's job feasible?

So as we pray for Steve & Sarah in their new sphere of work in Fremington, let us be encouraged to build on Steve's legacy, and endeavour to make the new Rector's job not only possible but also fulfilling, to the Glory of our great God and Father and the Lord Jesus Christ

John's involvement with occasional services will be at his discretion. If available, he will normally officiate at the weddings, baptisms or funerals of regular church members, but not normally at other occasional services.

NATURE NOTES

There is nothing more wonderful in the world of Nature than trees. There cannot be a day that goes by without me taking in a single majestic specimen or a woodland that has spread its cloak over the gentle Devon hills. Trees immediately take on the mood of the day whether gaily tossing their heads in a Summer breeze or fighting back against the gales of Autumn or forming dark skeletal silhouettes on a high skyline in Winter.

It is amazing to think that some British trees are over 1000 years old and although Britain is less covered by trees than our Continental neighbours we can at least claim that ours are perhaps the most ancient. The oldest will usually be found as a lonely figure, and though fungi may have eaten away the heart of them [making estimates of actual age difficult], as observers we are never in doubt of their venerability. I do not claim to be a tree hugger but certainly, deep emotions are evoked and imaginations wander, in the presence of something that may have seen both Queens Elizabeth.

It is therefore something of a shock when I find that some trees in the private landscape of my past are no longer there. For instance in the 'Beech Walk'



Manor Office, North Street, Crediton EX17 2BR www.symesrobinsonlee.co.uk - the old oak [the one and only tree on this road] no longer stands. Like the avenue of trees that must have lined this road to the countryside during its creation, it too has fallen to advancing suburbia.

But suburban trees also stay in my memory and I can still see the blossoms of cherry, lilac and shocking laburnum, as well as the smell of the sap of the impossible to climb poplars. Surely noone would arbitrarily fell a tree and I have only ever met one person who did not appreciate trees. A Texan work colleague of long ago complained in all seriousness, that he did not like the landscapes of Britain because "you could not see the scenery for the trees".

I wish he could have seen the trees of Knightshayes, where even the fallen victims add a defiant magnificence to the rolling hillsides. These prostrate lords of the manor remind me that the RHS and Kew issued a definitive and greatly updated method for tree planting following lessons learned after the hurricane of 1987. I have yet to witness anyone in the real world following this guidance. If you are in any doubt of when is the best time to plant a tree, the answer is "twenty years ago".




Mothering Sunday is on 15 March so we would welcome lots of children (young and not so young) bringing their Mothers to this service, to receive a posy of flowers on their special day.
