

NATURE NOTES

The Wonderful World of Lichens

There's a delicate tapestry of muted greys, greens, and yellows, quietly thriving all around us. How often do we pause to appreciate this intricate patchwork? They are everywhere. On walls, rooftops, pavements, tree trunks, branches, wooden benches, and even on seemingly inhospitable tarmac and plastic. Churches and churchyards are havens for these fascinating organisms. Welcome to the enchanting world of lichens!

Of the 2,000 species found in the UK, 700 flourish in burial grounds and churchyards. Many of these are rare and seldom seen elsewhere, making such sites veritable lichen sanctuaries. The diverse materials used for gravestones attract a wide assortment of lichens and lichenologists. The latter can be spotted with their noses close to their subjects, peering intently through magnifying lenses at their latest discovery.

Gravestones, church buildings, surrounding walls, paths, wooden benches, and ancient trees each offer unique conditions, attracting different lichen communities. Growing at a mere 1mm per year, some lichens are as ancient as the gravestones they adorn.

Lichens are remarkable survivors, thriving where few others can - from the North Pole to the summit of Everest, and deep into the Sahara Desert. Unprotected, they can even endure the intense radiation of space.

So, what exactly is a lichen? It is a symbiotic partnership between two organisms living as one. The visible component and main structure is a fungus (found in all lichens). It is partnered with either an alga or a cyanobacteria. The latter two feed the fungus, which in return provides them with a home in what would otherwise be an inhospitable location for them.

Lichens come in three main forms: crust-like (crustose), shrubby/branching/hair-like (fruticose), and leaf-like (foliose). Those found on gravestones, stonework, and paths are typically crustose. While most lichens are known by their Latin names, some

have charming, descriptive names like 'sunburst lichen' and 'pepper pot lichen.' The magical string of sausages lichen, beard-like and dangling from trees in damp woodlands, is an indicator of a pristine, unpolluted atmosphere.

Have you ever wondered where the purple dye of a Roman toga came from, or the oranges and browns of a Harris Tweed jacket, or the earthy fragrances in perfumes? Ponder no more, they are all from lichens!

The natural world is extraordinary in its complexity and variety, and lichens are no exception. They are all around us, waiting to be enjoyed and marvelled. Many are on our doorstep (literally in some cases). Often understated, they are unlikely to be as boring as you might have thought. Take a moment to delve into the wonderful world of lichens - you might be surprised by what you find!


