

WHAT'S ON

NATURE NOTES

Autumnal Tips

rainbow lends a splash of colour to the iron grey sky, while a murder of crows sweeps up from the bare field, and far off, rays of sunshine flash on the white wings of circling seagulls. The trees bow beneath the wind, sending leaves scurrying across the ground. Within seconds, the grey clouds are emptying at pace and cold rain pours down my neck. I shiver and moan to myself, but then think, actually, this is really exhilarating. It might be rather different to last week when I felt the warmth of the sun as I sat drinking tea in the garden, but that is Autumn! The last sunny days reminding us of Summer, and the forecast of Winter.

So I dash out between the showers to put away garden equipment, tie things down, move plant pots to more sheltered positions, bring in the geraniums and tender plants and generally tidy up. That includes picking up the recycling boxes and the bin, the contents of which have blown across the yard.

It is time to:

Empty and clean the greenhouse Mulch the garden with manure, leaf

mould, wood chippings

Gather leaves to rot for next year' mulch Plant tulip bulbs

Plant and prune fruit bushes and shrubs Check the car for antifreeze

Protect outside taps

Make sure the heating works and get in a fuel supply

Are there candles (and torches) available in case of a power cut?

Clean the bird feeders and begin feeding the birds. I have to tie the lid down on the dustbin where I keep the food. Last year the squirrels worked out how to get the lid off and even chewed through the string holding the lid down.

Scrub the bird baths, water feeders and refill with water each day, particularly after a frost.

Repair the bug hotel, adding fresh wood, sticks, hollow plant stems and pine cones.

Last Autumn, we drilled holes in a chunk of oak and watched as caterpillars built a nest and sealed themselves in.

Position the bird feeder so birds have emergency access to a hedge or tree if a predator appears, but also so that it can be a great opportunity to photograph, record and learn about different birds that visit the garden.

What about a hedgehog corner? A safe place for hedgehogs to hibernate is just as important as food. Wild corners, log piles, a shelter or hedgehog house offer a ready-made safe haven, protecting them from predators and the elements.

Leaving out food irregularly in a different area of the garden is helpful. Hedgehogs will enjoy dried black soldier fly larvae, which is a safe, sustainable treat and protein-rich option to help hedgehogs gain weight. Hedgehog-specific food mixes are nutritionally balanced and specially formulated to meet their needs, or plain kitten biscuits or meat-based wet dog or cat food. Fresh water, but never milk, which can upset their stomachs. It is important to make sure that any water supply is safe. Last week, I pulled a hedgehog out of a water trough which it had fallen down into and sadly, could not climb out. This can be avoided by adding rocks or hedgehog ladders to ponds and water sources as a means of escape.

Exhilarating weather (wet and windy) as we have just experienced with Storm Amy, calm, sunny days or crisp, frosty mornings, snow-covered landscapes by day and clear starry skies at night, icicles and Jack Frost – whatever the weather – it is Mother Nature in all her ferocious and gentle glory. Like the plants and animals, we humans must just hunker down and dream of Spring.


